I have thought of an easy cloud dough recipe that will take on aromas to evoke child hood memories of home. A chance for pretend play, perhaps reminiscence and imagination. Why not make your own snow cone parlour and serve up a smellicious cone.

What you need:

Tools:

Small Paper cups or bowls to act as the snow cone holder.
Fork, spoon, knife for stirring.
A mixing bowl.
Measuring spoon.
Table cloth to play and make on.

To decorate your cone cup:

Paper to decorate your paper cup or bowl
Optional pencils/crayons/felt-tips to colour and draw.

To make the snow dough:

Corn flour, or plain flour.
Bicarbonate of soda.
Vegetable oil or coconut oil.
Optional food colouring.



Ingredients that will smell heavenly. cocoa, sorell cordial, creamed coconut and a part of a medium mango.

Consistency once flour and oil is mixed. should look like this. Do not knead, only stir. A touch of bicarbonate of soda will give a sparkle to the mix.



Mix mango puree into the flour and oil mix.

Mix sorell with flour and tablespoon of coconut oil.



Colours made with cocoa powder, or food dyes.
